NEW TESTAMENT SURVEY

COURSE DESCRIPTION

An introduction to the authorship and contents of the New Testament books. Special attention will be given to important persons, places, events, as well as to key chapters in the New Testament revelation.

RATIONALE

The aim of this course is structured to help the student interpret New Testament biblical passages in their proper context. Within the New Testament, there are insights about human beings, teachings for virtuous living, truths about the Savior, and principles for living an abundant life for Christ. The student will also be challenged to evaluate traditional and critical options of interpretation.

B. Course Requirements Checklist

After reading the Course Syllabus and Student Expectations, the student will complete the assigned reading and work for Module/Week 2.

C. Discussion Board Forums (3)

The student will complete 2 Discussion Board Forums. Discussion boards are collaborative learning experiences. Therefore, the student will create a thread in response to the provided prompt for each forum. Each thread must be at least 250 words and demonstrate course-related knowledge. In addition to the thread, the student will reply to at least 1 other classmates' thread. Each reply must be 75–100 words. (MLO: A, B, E)

D. Interactive Speech Assignments (2)

The student will complete 2 speeches that allow him or her to explore the content and historical background of the New Testament. Each class member will be given a subject from the New Testament. Each student will have no less than five minutes no more than 10 minutes on each subject to present to class. (MLO: D, E)

E. Biblical Worldview in Romans Essay

The student will describe what Romans teaches about six essential aspects of the biblical worldview, including God, creation, sin, salvation, ethics, and eschatology. The student will also explain how this teaching enables him or her to articulate and defend (apologetically) the biblical worldview. The paper must be 1,200–1,300 words, double-spaced, and formatted in a single Microsoft Word document using current APA, MLA, or Turabian style (whichever corresponds to the student's degree program). (MLO: A, E)

F. Tests (4)

The student will take 4 module tests. Each test will cover the Reading & Study material for the assigned module/week. Each test will be open-book/open-notes, contain 15 multiple-choice and true/false questions, and have a 30-minute time limit. In the corresponding Reading & Study folder, the student will find a document of study questions that will help prepare him or her for each test. (MLO: B, C, D)

V. COURSE REQUIREMENTS AND ASSIGNMENTS

A. Textbook readings, web articles, and lecture presentations (MLO: A, B, C, D)

B. Research Paper

The student is required to write a 2-3-page research paper addressing a topic from the list of approved topics provided in the course. The paper must incorporate at least 6 scholarly sources, which must be formatted in correct, current APA, MLA or Turabian style, and be accompanied by a properly formatted title page, table of contents, and bibliography.

C. Quizzes (4)

The student will complete 4 open-book/open-notes quizzes. Each quiz will contain 5-10 multiple-choice, true/false, and/or fill-in-the-blank questions.

VI. COURSE GRADING AND POLICIES

A. Grading System: 300 points for Biblical Worldview in Romans Essay, (3) Discussion Boards 75 points (Replies 25 points for each), (2) Speech 200 points for each & (4) Test 50 points for each.

Discussion Board 1 Instructions:

In a thread consisting of 250 words, discuss why knowing the cultural and historical background of the New Testament is important for our understanding the message of the New Testament documents. Reply to at least 1 classmates' thread. Your replies must consist of 75–100 words that bring clarity to and significantly advance the discussion.

Discussion Board Two Instructions:

In a thread consisting of 250 words, discuss the nature and extent of Jesus Christ's humility based on Philippians 2:1–11. What are the implications of Christ's humility for Christians? How should we implement Christ's example of humility in our personal relationships? Reply to at least 1 classmates' thread. Your replies must consist of 75–100 words that bring clarity to and significantly advance the discussion.

Discussion Board Three Instructions:

In a thread consisting of 250 words, discuss in the Book of Revelation the seven churches in Chapter 2-3. Contrast their spiritual condition and Compare the promises given to the faithful. How does this apply to us today? Reply to at least 1 classmates' thread. Your replies must consist of 75-100 words that bring clarity to and significantly advance the discussion.
